Your proposal must contain:

1. The Preliminary Book Proposal, which includes: a) Title, b) authors, c) authors affiliations, d) e-mail addresses, e) corresponding author, f) key words, g) unique selling points (features and topics that distinguish your book from the others), h) competitive literature, i) a summary highlighting the core topics/concepts of the book and to whom it is intended to (for example, Doctoral Students initiating in Statistics, or Advanced undergraduate students and/or graduate students in the field of Probability, Statistics, Actuarial Science and Applications etc.) and a table of contents.
2. If you have part or the complete manuscript, please attach the PDF;
3. A biography/CV of the author(s);
4. Approximate submission date of the final manuscript;
